



AMERICAN SOCIETY OF COLON AND RECTAL SURGEONS APPLICATION FOR INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL SCHOLARSHIP

The ASCRS International Travel Scholarship is meant to provide funding for young colorectal surgeons residing outside the United States and Canada, to assist with travel to the U.S. for the educational experience of attending the Annual Scientific Meeting of the American Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons (ASCRS).

The focus of these scholarships will be on colorectal surgeons practicing in parts of the world where the specialty of colorectal surgery is not well established and in areas of great need. The scholarships are intended for general or colorectal surgeons in their first three years of practice in colorectal surgery or a similar GI practice in areas where the specialty of colorectal surgery does not exist. Up to four scholarships are offered annually. These scholarships are designed to identify young surgeons with a high potential to advance the specialty within their community. The ideal candidate should be active in research and/or teaching, have been published, or wish to pursue an academic career. Selection of the scholarship recipients will be based on the applicant's experience and potential to impact the specialty and their community.

The criteria and eligibility for the ASCRS International Travel Scholarship is described in detail on the ASCRS pages of the ASCRS website. Applicants may complete the application below and based on eligibility and criteria choose to apply.

The candidate should complete this form and the following supporting documents to ascrs@fascrs.org.

- Provide two letters of reference with one of the references from the applicant's department chair or program director;
- Provide a current and complete curriculum vitae;
- Write a letter stating:
 - Career development plan
 - Perceived personal and community needs
 - Proposed plan to expand colorectal surgical services in their country of origin

All applications will be reviewed by the ASCRS International Committee. Applicants will receive notification of final decisions from the International Committee.
